carvings & pyrography for Show

Whittling is an art that has been practiced for many centuries. Many fine carvings have been made with just a pocketknife.

There are four prerequisites for good whittling: 1. A good two- or three- bladed pocketknife with a handle about three inches long. It should have one large strong blade and one or two smaller blades. 2. An oil stone or whetstone for sharpening the knife. 3. The right kind of wood for whittling. White pine, basswood, cottonwood, cedar, poplar, and willow are the best, for they all have straight grains. 4. Some idea in your head as to what you want to make.



This is the correct way to hold a pocketknife for ordinary whittling. You get better leverage by holding the knife part way up on the blade.



Hold the knife like this for rough, free cutting.

Always steady your hand

with your thumb.

The Barlow knife has one blade for rough work and one for whittling.

A strong spring is usually the hallmark of a good knife.

The ideal 3-bladed pocketknife has one strong blade and two thin blades for whittling.



A small ridged knife is good because the blade does not have a tendency to close.



Dick Christensen, a fixture at the Oshkosh Senior Center Woodshop for over two decades, passed away on Tuesday, February 22, 2022 after a long and active life. His obituary from the Oshkosh Northwestern is reproduced below.



Oshkosh - Richard L. Christensen, age 93, passed away surrounded by family on Tuesday, February 22, 2022, at Eden Meadows in Oshkosh. He was born on January 3, 1929, in Detroit, MI, to the late Harvey and Evelyn (Frank) Christensen.

He attended Fordson High School where he was active in swimming and cross country. He then served in the Army from 1951 to 1953. Upon coming home he completed his degree in Packaging Engineering from Michigan State University. During that time he married his high school sweetheart who he met at a DeMolay dance. They settled in Illinois and raised their 3 children. They then retired to Oshkosh, WI to be with family.

Dick was a long time member of the Mid-Wis. Chippers Woodcarving Club serving on its Board of Directors from 2010 - 2014. For many years Dick supervised the Oshkosh Senior Center Woodshop and held numerous bird carving classes there. Many Chippers got their start in bird carving with Dick and others honed their skills and learned much. Dick encouraged his students to enter their carvings in competition, and he was instrumental in many carvers joining the Mid-Wisconsin Chippers Woodcarving Club.

Dick Christensen was the featured Carver in *Whittle Bits and Pieces* back in May 2013. Paul Wolters' 2013 interview with Dick is reproduced below.

When I visited Dick, I had the opportunity to view many of his beautiful wood carvings on display throughout his home. Richard was born and raised in Dearborn, Michigan. Married to his wife Jean for the past 58 years, they have 3 children. They now make their residence in Oshkosh.

Dick attended Michigan State University and graduated with a bachelors degree in mechanical engineering. He was employed with companies like General Foods, Quaker State, and finally John Brown Engineering, Construction and Management Company, where he spent the last 17 years of his employment. Richard is fond of guns and trap shooting. He became interested in carving by building his first gun stock. He had built several other gun stocks when he saw an ad "How to Carve Birds" at the local high school. That began a hobby 20 years ago which resulted in Dick becoming the woodcarving instructor and supervisor in the "Wood Shop" at the Oshkosh Sr. Center for the past 13 years.

Dick has become an active member of the Mid-Wis Chippers and has served on the board of directors for the past 4 years. He has judged at shows throughout the state, given various demonstrations, and displayed his carvings at our shows winning many ribbons.

Dick has other hobbies which he is very involved in. He trains and shows hunting dogs, competes with them at AKC dog shows, field trials and obedience classes. He also ties his own hand made flies and has made his own fishing poles.

Dick was also involved with the Boy Scouts of America for 20 years, holding offices from Scoutmaster to Council and District Operations.



Mom's Influence, Now a Teacher

A profile of carver Lee Belanger by Paul Wolters

Lee Belanger never really started woodcarving until he read an article in "Wood Magazine". Around 1993 Lee's mother, a wood carver herself, influenced Lee to give it try and that's how Lee started carving for past 29 years.

Lee is married to Janet and resides in the Hortonville area. They have 3 children and 4 grandchildren. Lee served in the U. S. Air Force for 4 years, and was an electrician by trade for Keil Werner Electric for 35 years, plus 5 years for D-K Electric until his retirement.





I wanted to share this photo of Lee & his granddaughter Asja, who was somewhat shy at the time in 2014, but who just celebrated her 13th birthday.

Lee joined the Mid-Wisconsin Chippers in 2007, and presently is on the board of directors for the club. He displays many of his carvings at "Show & Tell" at regular meetings. He and Janet attend many of the carving shows, sometimes visiting and other times showing his whimsical carvings.

To further educate his skills in carving, Lee took classes from Tom Hower, Rick Jensen and Rich Weatherbee.

Lee became a teacher and wanted to share his skills in cottonwood bark carving with others. He taught at Bubolz and Mosquito Hill Nature Centers, Swanstone Gardens in Green Bay. He also taught at Lakeland College in Sheboygan, the Eau Claire Carving Club, and at the Thompson Center in Appleton. Recently, he taught in Boulder Junction, Wisconsin for the final 6 years of the Musky Carvers Workshop.

Lee's other interests keeping him busy are building cabinets and bowl turning.

This is a piece that Lee wanted to share about one of his students:

"I have met some very interesting people and one guy who been a carpenter all his life took my whimsical cottonwood bark class and was told by me to make everything a little out of plumb because it is a whimsical carving. He could not get it through his head about making everything crooked. Everything on his house was perfectly straight as he always did when doing his carpentry work in the past.

A Lanel Discussion by Long Time Woodcarvers

Jim Plier, Richard Young, Dick Turner, Harold Kinas & Jim Craig





So how did you get started carving?

Jim Plier credits a friend Earl Ludtke with inspiring him.

Dick Turner was a duck hunter and fell into carving decoys at Fox Valley Tech.

Richard Young started out building model ships and wanted to embellish them with carvings.

Harold Kinas started carving as a kid. Harold carved a little dog when he was ten and then was making balsa wood models, especially airplanes in the time of WWII.

Jim Craig's best friend Ron Osgood got him into carving 35 years ago in 1987.



Jim Craig likes Flexcut tools and basswood for carving.

Many people start carving then "life happens" and they later return to carving. That was the case with Dick Turner who after beginning at Fox Valley Tech quit carving from 2009 to 2014 when he started carving again; this time at the Oshkosh Senior Center.

MWC has a reputation for bird carving. Jim Plier has carved many ducks, so has Dick Turner and Jim Craig's first carving was a canvasback duck and ducks and chickadees are his favorites.



Richard Young's first carving was a carved Neptune for a model of Napoleon's barge. He has 14 of his models at the Maritime Museum in Manitowoc. He started carving at 28 and is 84 now. He has taught carving in the past and now helps carvers at the Manitowoc Senior Center.

Harold Kinas gave up carving when he went to college, but resumed in retirement. Once he tried to carve small ducks out of as many different types of wood that he could find. He has taught carving at Waukesha Tech and Rockler. Harold now likes to carve Santas.

Harold Kinas started carving using a razor blade wrapped with tape. His favorite wood is basswood Harold once asks a fellow to guess what kind of wood a small carving was made of:

it was a dried brussel sprout plant!

WOOD SANDING BLOCKS WITH ABRANET SANDING MESH & BENCH HOOKS FOR SALE!

The Oshkosh Senior Center (OSC) Woodshop has bench hooks for sale.

There are both left handed and righted versions available. Bench hooks protect table tops when carving and are very useful for chip carvers, relief carvings, and other small carving projects. The 10" x 12" Bench hook has a carving surface between the wood stops of approximately 8 3/4" x 10 3/4".

The price is \$25. Proceeds support the OSC Woodshop.



The bench hook bottom is affixed with a slip resistant shelf liner.

The OSC Woodshop also a sanding kit for sale for \$20.

The kit includes: 2 wood sanding blocks and 8 pieces of Abranet sanding mesh. Each block has a hook fastener surface to removably affix loop backed sanding mesh (Velcro type attachment).

Large block is 2 1/2" x 5". Small block is 1" x 3 3/4". Sanding mesh grit sizes are: P80, P120, P240 & P400.

Sanding mesh is wonderful stuff, better & more long lasting than regular sandpaper.

Josh Guge - Brook Trout Carving & Painting Class




