

# Power Carving Demonstration Part 1 by Chris Rigotti, Steve Binder & Gene Bengel

Flexible shaft, micromotor, rotary and reciprocating tools plus dust collectors

Wow! What a great presentation! Chris started it off showing his 1/6 HP Foredom SR52 and covering safety issues including: using safety glasses, leather gloves and a leather apron. Care must be used to avoid any materials which may get caught in a spinning bit, so woven carving gloves can be a hazard. Chris covered operation and maintenance, noting that the shaft should be greased every 10 hours of use to ensure long life. A reciprocated tool was also demoed and Chris showed a Ram 45 micromotor which takes both 1/8" & 3/32" bits and operates at 45,000 rpms. Another handy tool is the 90 degree sander handpiece available from Foredom.

Chris also had a 30,000 rpm Foredom micromotor that ran on AC or battery power. It had a 5 hour run time with a 3 hour charge time.

Other tools included a rechargeable Dremel autosander having a 20 minute recharge time that is suitable for sanding birds, and for big projects a horizontal grinder. For safety the grinder is a two hand operation so the workpiece needs to be securely anchored.



# Power Carving Demonstration Part 1 by Chris Rigotti, Steve Binder & Gene Bengel

Flexible shaft, micromotor, rotary and reciprocating tools plus dust collectors

Gene Bengel demonstrated a typical Dremel adapted with a flexible shaft handpiece, but Dremel also makes a tool (Dremel Model 732) designed specifically for hanging. The long flexible shaft allows for use of a smaller handpiece for greater control and less hand fatigue. It fits smaller hands better too. The high torque means that the motor must be securely attached to the hanger. Gene's hanger is a repurposed IV stand.

Gene also demonstrated a compact Raizaire tabletop dust collector that has a quieter operation than most dust collectors. Gene modifed its normal side air discharge to go upwards to better work in group carving situations. Raizaire also makes adapters to do the same thing.

Steve Binder prefers a tabletop control model of Foredom rather than the typical footpedal speed control. The tabletop model has a heavy base to counteract the startup torque. Steve showed his high powered Tornado 1000 dust collector and a downdraft, through the fan blade, model made at the Oshkosh Senior Center. Many of the flexible shaft and micromotor rotary power carvers come with the ability to reverse direction of the rotation which may be handy to address changes in wood grain direction.

The presentation was well attended and it was particularly useful for handcarvers who are contemplating adding power carving to their skillset.

November's meeting will have Part II of Power Carving by Keitth Melzer and Patrick Pelkey who will focus on the business end of the power carving machines - the bits, burs, sanding drums and accessories.



## Jump Buck Jump! White Tailed Deer

Leaping Buck- Choice of three patterns!



This Betsy Popp Class is six days total (over 40 hours of classtime instruction, carving & painting). Students will choose from three different Wisconsin White Tailed Deer Buck patterns: The Take Off; Leap!; and Touchdown! The carving will be done in butternut wood. The class fee (\$225 for Mid-Wis. Chipper (MDC) members & \$235 for nonmembers) includes one cutout of your choice (both buck & antlers), eyes, a pattern packet, reference photos; putties & paints. Extra cutouts are available for \$35 each.






