# Richeson & Krummick Pyrography Class- Leather Bookmarks Thursdays 1-3 pm November 16, 30 & December 7



Several patterns will be available including those depicted and many more.

Techniques will also be discussed for applying color. Students will be taught to apply patterns to leather using water instead of graphite paper. Pattern transfer materials will be provided for use in class.

Students should bring their burner including writing and shading nibs and a craft or xacto knife for cutting leather. Colored oil pencils may be used to enhance your design if you so choose.

Two books on Leather Pyrography by Lora Irish and Minisa Robinson will be available in class for review.

Students may wish to create their own designs.

The bookmark format lends itself to many themes including totem poles, lighthouses, long fish like muskies or gar, as well as geometric designs, nature patterns such as falling leaves and vines. Names and initials may be inscribed too!



Pyrography techniques are used to burn this classic windmill scene on a 9" x 12" birch plywood plaque.

This pattern may be adapted by students of different skill levels by omitting one or more design elements such as clouds, geese, carts, etc.

Plaque and test strip are included.

Students will bring their pyrography kit including burner machine and pen with their favorite nibs including those suitable to work as a writer, skew, and shader, graphite transfer paper, white vinyl and kneaded erasers, red or blue pen.

# WOOD SANDING BLOCKS WITH ABRANET SANDING MESH & BENCH HOOKS FOR SALE AT OSHKOSH SENIOR CENTER!

The Oshkosh Senior Center (OSC) Woodshop has bench hooks for sale.

There are both left handed and righted versions available. Bench hooks protect table tops when carving and are very useful for chip carvers, relief carvings, and other small carving projects. The 10" x 12" Bench hook has a carving surface between the wood stops of approximately 8 3/4" x 10 3/4".

The price is \$25. Proceeds support the OSC Woodshop.



The OSC Woodshop also has a sanding kit for sale for \$20.

The kit includes: 2 wood sanding blocks and 8 pieces of Abranet sanding mesh. Each block has a hook fastener surface to removably affix loop backed sanding mesh (Velcro type attachment).

Large block is 2 1/2" x 5". Small block is 1" x 3 3/4". Sanding mesh grit sizes are: P80, P120, P240 & P400.

Sanding mesh is wonderful stuff, better & more long lasting than regular sandpaper.






Floyd Rhadigan describes his style as a mixture of Ozark & Scandinavian Flat Plane Carving.



WHAT TO BRING: Quality and sharp hand tools and knives

**BIOGRAPHY:** I entered the world of woodcarving in 1970, with the help of a family friend, Smokey Joe Briemuiller. He was one of those characters who fascinated me as a child. He carved small animals, Indians and Hill People. He had the aroma of wood and cigar smoke about him.

Smokey Joe showed me the basics- how to make a pattern, how to cut out a blank on a band saw, and how to make a knife from a straight razor, the most important how to was to keep that knife sharp. I used that knife and a box of patterns, and began to carve as much as I could. In those early days, there were very few tools on the market. A person could find full size mallet tools but little else. So I relied on my homemade carving knife.

In 1973, I bought my first carving book, "HOW TO CARVE CHARACTERS IN WOOD" by H.S. "Andy" Anderson. This really opened my eyes to the type of carver I wanted to become. I carved every project in the book. This made me thirst for more.

Then Harold Enlow came into my life, with his book "CARVING FIGURE CARICATURES in the OZARK STYLE." I thought I had died and gone to heaven. Harold not only carved the way I wanted to learn, but he also introduced me to palm tools. They were what was missing!

Harold came out with more books, each as exciting as the first. I carved every idea in his books. I started to develop my own style, a mix between Ozark and Flat Plane Scandinavian carving.

I began to teach my style of carving in 1976 for the city of Mt. Clemens, MI Adult Education Program. I moved to Warren, MI and started to teach for the Warren Parks & Rec. Dept. In 1991, I moved to Saline, MI where I started teaching a weekly class and began participating in wood carving shows around the state, As my work became known, my teaching increased. I started to teach at the two major woodcarving seminars in Michigan, "Creative Woodcarving Seminar" in

Cadillac, MI (which I now run) and the MWCA (Michigan Wood Carvers Association) in Midland, MI. I now instruct annually at the Wood Carvers Round Up, in Evert, MI and the North East Carvers Round Up, in Honesdale, PA. I was honored to teach in Twin Falls, Idaho, with the CCA. I am excited about returning in May.

<u>Wood Carving</u> has opened many doors for me and I have met the greatest people in the world. I had the honor to win Best of Show in the 2005 CCA Carving Competition. The biggest honor in my career was to become a member of the club all my heroes belong to, the Caricature Carvers of America.

I have a lot more to learn on this journey. May we meet and carve together along the way.
