Harold Kinas Passes Away

Chipper Harold Kinas has passed away. Harold joined the Mid-Wis. Chippers in 2019 after moving from Milwaukee to Ripon in 2017. He was a frequent participant in Chippers meetings and shared his skills at the Princeton and Berlin Carving Clubs.

In a 2022 Chipper's panel discussion of longtime carvers, Harold recalled started carving as a kid. He first used a razor blade wrapped with tape. At age ten he carved a little dog and later was making balsa wood models, especially of airplanes during World War II. Harold gave up carving when he went to college, but resumed in retirement. One of his carving projects was carving small ducks out of as many different types of wood that he could find. A nativity scene that he carved was displayed at the Ripon Public Library in 2022. Also, in the past Harold taught carving at Waukesha Tech and Rockler.

March 31, 1926 — March 25, 2024 Ripon

Harold Kinas, a cherished educator, musician, and craftsman, passed away peacefully on Sunday, March 24, 2024, just a week shy of his 98th birthday.

Born in Germantown, Wisconsin, on March 31, 1926, to Theodore and Lilly (Zarling) Kinas, Harold was a beacon of knowledge and faith in his community.

In 1948, Harold married his beloved wife, Bessie Wehausen, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Their union was a hip lasting over seven decades until Bessie's passing in

testament to love and partnership, lasting over seven decades until Bessie's passing in 2019.

A proud graduate of Concordia Teachers College, Harold furthered his education with a Master's Degree in Education from Wayne State University. His dedication to teaching touched the lives of hundreds of students across Lutheran elementary schools in Michigan, California, Indiana, and Wisconsin. Harold's commitment to education continued beyond the classroom as he took on the role of principal, shaping the future of Lutheran education.

Music was Harold's second language, and he served as a church organist, sharing his gift well into his 70s. His devotion to the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, was evident through his active participation and leadership in various church roles.

In retirement, Harold, alongside Bessie, founded Kinas Crafts. Their wood carvings, known for their whimsy and warmth, adorn countless homes. Harold's passion for woodcarving extended to teaching, where he guided novice carvers well into his 90s.

The Kinas family roots shifted from Milwaukee to Ripon in 2017. He found incredible friendship in the people of Messiah Lutheran Church, the Berlin Carving Club, the Princeton Carving Club, and the residents of Russell Manor.

After Bessie's passing in 2019, Harold continued to live a life filled with purpose and service with the help of his family, friends and neighbors.

Harold is survived by his children, Paul Kinas (Susan), John Kinas (Debra), Krista Norton (David), and Karen Gamboa (Gen); his grandchildren, Matthew Kinas, Aaron Kinas (Melissa), Jesse Norton (Helen Truax), Joshua Norton, Andrew Kinas (Kacie Ward), Sara Ratliff (Nathan), Jonathan Gamboa, Vincent Gamboa (Jenn Wong) and Danielle Gamboa; and his great-grandchildren, Matthew Kinas, Kaia Kinas, Aloh Kinas, Tybalt Norton-Truax, Quentin Norton-Truax, Atlas Kinas, and Orson Kinas. He is preceded in death by his parents, Theodore and Lilly Kinas; and his beloved wife, Bessie Kinas.

A life so beautifully lived deserves to be beautifully remembered. Please join us in celebrating Harold's life. A visitation will be held from 9:30 - 11:00am on Tuesday, April 2, 2024, at Messiah Lutheran Church, 500 Mayparty Dr., Ripon, WI 54971.

Memorial service for Harold will be held on Tuesday, April 2, 2024 at 11:00am following the visitation at Messiah Lutheran Church in Ripon, with Rev. Bryan Fritsch officiating.




































Show 'N Tell Photos - March 3rd Meeting

If you are entering carvings/pyrography to be judged,

Fill out a Judging Entry Form & bring to the April Meeting.

(If you have already sent your form in, no need,

but if you have changes or have not sent in an entry, please do so now.

This will help speed registration on show day.

If you cannot make the April meeting, mail your entry form to Paul now.

A copy of the Entry Form & The Rules is attached to this newsletter.

You may make any changes to your entries on Show Day.

Show Day Check In Process

Prior to Show Day, you will be contacted with:

- your Table Number (plus a letter designation **if** sharing a table **or** part of a club table).

Your Table Number is very important.

The Table # identifies where your table location & is used in the judging registration process.

On Show Day you may arrive for table set up beginning at 6:30 am.

First, go to the Show Registration table on the south (river) side of the convention center and get (1) your exhibitor or volunteer wristband, and (2) show program with table locations.

If you have a helper, they will get an exhibitor wristband too.

The Show Registration table is inside the hallway from the building entrance adjacent the east side parking lot at the river between the Leach amphitheater and the Convention Center.

Second, After getting your wristband, you have from 6:45 until 8 am sharp to enter your carvings at the Judging Registration Tables. Judging Registration is in the hallway on the side of the convention center exhibition hall facing the hotel (same area as in 2023).

There will be four lines. Each line will be for a specified range of table numbers.

Go to the line designated for your table number!

The registrar will check your entry and receive your carving(s) for placement in the judging area. After your carvings are received, you are done until you called to pick them up after judging ends. Judges will wear Judges ribbons and be available for critiques **AFTER** all Judging is completed.

All entries for Judging MUST be received no later than 8 am. Judging will start promptly at 8 am.





Rules & Guidelines for the Mid-Wisconsin Chippers Woodcarving Show

Definitions: "Cut-out" is wood shaped by bandsaw or a similar saw such as a coping saw.

"Rough-out" is wood shaped by a machine duplicator.

Carvers should enter in one of the following classifications, but *once competing cannot retreat to a lower class*. Any carver who has won three (3) blue ribbons, or Best of Class, must move up to the next higher Class. Winners of Best of Show must move up two levels. See Nos. 8 & 9 below for "Best of" definitions. Ribbons won at ANY judged competition count towards class advancement.

Youth: Open to any carver under the age of 18 sponsored through a registered Table; limited to two entries per carver.

Novice: <u>For a beginning carver.</u> A novice has not won three (3) blue ribbons in any category, nor Best of Class, nor Best of Show, at <u>any judged carving competition</u>. Carving from Rough-outs and class projects are allowed.

Intermediate: For an experienced carver regardless of whether they have competed before. Intermediate carvers have developed skill beyond the novice level. Carvings from rough-outs and class projects are allowed. This is the next level above novice.

Open: The next level above intermediate. Any carver, except Masters, may enter Open Class. Cut-outs are allowed. No rough-outs allowed. No class projects where the instructor has carved or painted on the entered piece.

Master: For expert carvers. Master carvers have developed their skill beyond the Open Class. Cut-outs are allowed, but no rough-outs, and no class projects where the instructor has carved or painted on the entered piece. Artistry as well as craftsmanship, originality, carving skill, attention to detail in all attributes including habitat. The ultimate level.

1. Entries must be in the judging area between 6:45 AM and 8:00 AM; judging starts at 8:00 AM.

- 2. All entries must be created and carved primarily in wood with two exceptions. Carved Gourds have a separate category and Pyrography may be on various media (wood, leather, paper, gourds, etc.)
- 3. You must have a display table to enter judging.
- 4. Tables may be shared, but in order to enter judging, both entrants must pay the full table fee.
- 5. Carving entries must have been completed since the last MWC show, and not have been entered in **this** show before.
- 6. All carvings for judging must have the date and carvers name fixed to the piece. Entrant must temporarily cover that name even if on the bottom of the entry; the date should remain uncovered.
- 7. You may enter up to 4 carvings in competition; a maximum of two in the same category. An exception is for a "club table", which may enter up to six carvings, but only one per person (Each person uses a separate entry form.)
- 8. Best of Class winners will be chosen from the blue ribbon winners from all the categories for each class.
- 9. Best of Show will be selected from the Best of Class winners from all classes.
- 10. Ribbons from previous years or from other shows may not be displayed.
- 11. Carvers may rent more than one table, but each carver is still bound by the four entry limit.
- 12. Exhibitors must furnish their own covers and floor length table skirts. (Standard 8' table)
- 13. Tables must be reserved by April 15. Reservations **received** after April 15 will be charged an additional \$5.00.
- 14. Please observe show hours. No packing up before 4 PM. If you carve at your table, please clean up your area.
- 15. If you sell carvings, you are responsible for collecting sales tax.
